Please join the Laboratory to Combat Human Trafficking in collaboration with the Larimer County Department of Human Services, local and state law enforcement agencies and other community partners for a deeper dive into human trafficking of youth in Larimer County. The crime of human trafficking intersects with many other vulnerabilities and experiences. Those who experience trafficking may also be victims of child abuse or domestic violence, they may be experiencing homelessness or go on multiple runs, or they may suffer from mental illness or substance abuse disorders. Because these vulnerable populations often come into the purview of child welfare and the foster care system, it is vital for these professionals to receive this training.

WHAT YOU WILL LEARN:

- How being trauma-responsive can help you build a case and how to integrate that into your practice
- How to teach harm reduction and safety planning to youth
- Recognizing stages of change and using motivational interviewing
- How to use Trails and screening tools
- How to work alongside law enforcement to support survivors and their families

This training will provide space to workshop these skillsets
